




Form 5

As part of our dinosaur topic, we have learnt about Mary Anning. Mary was born in 1799 in Lyme Regis. Her father sold fossils to tourists. When Mary was 12, her brother Joseph dug up the skull of an ichthyosaurus (which means 'fish lizard'). The skull was more than a metre long. Later, Mary found the rest of the skeleton. She sold it for £23 (around £1,400 today). Mary was the first person to find a whole Ichthyosaurus skeleton.

Sadly, many professionals refused to acknowledge Mary's discoveries and she wasn't given the credit she deserved. It is only since her death at 47, that her work has been celebrated. Form One really enjoyed this lesson as it made them realise that dinosaurs actually roamed the land that we live on and that they can visit the Jurassic Coast in Devon and have a try at fossil hunting.
