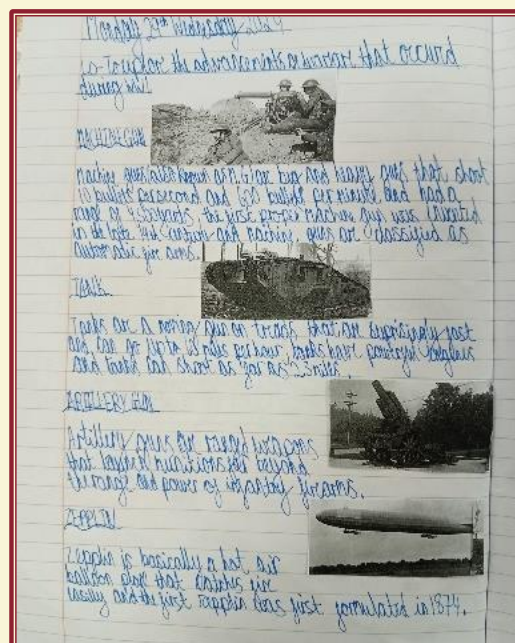
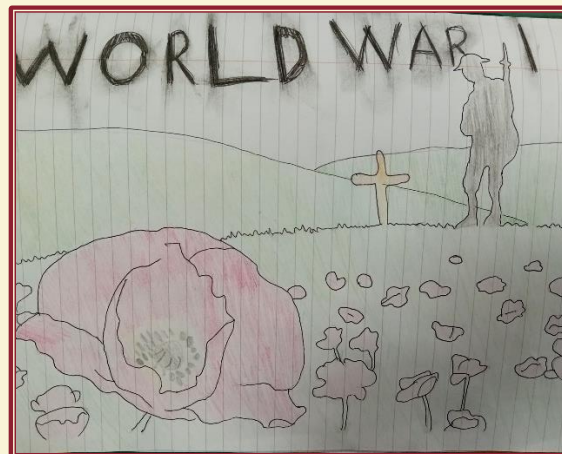
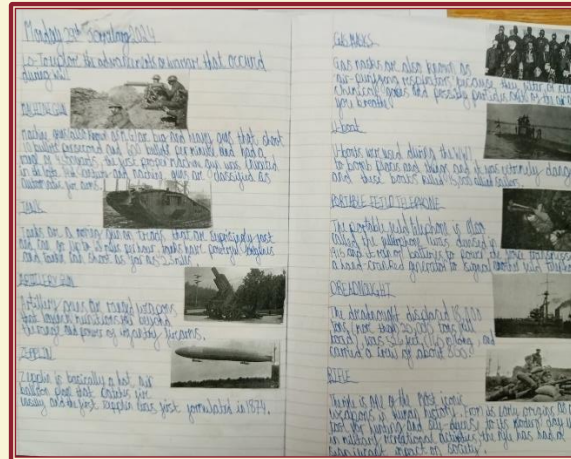
Form 6
